- Report on Last VNC Board Meeting
- Old Business:
  - a. Possible action based on report from Jesse Holzer, CD11 Transportation 5 min Jesse H Assistant re: placing Bike Lanes on Rose Ave between Lincoln and Pacific Jesse reported the new plan results in only 2 parking spots and one loading zone lost at 7th & Rose. Committee Discussion – no action taken
  - b. Discussion and Possible Action re: Neighborhood Committee 5 min Bill B accomplishments and priorities
    - Document changes proposed action postponed to next meeting
  - c. Report on Sidewalk Repairs. 25 locations were patched 3/24 367 locations submitted for repair; 208 minor repairs (for immediate, temporary repair), 159 major repairs (require repaving; as needed tree removal, curb replacement and other improvements prior to repair. These will be long term projects requiring city prioritization and funding)
    - Identification of additional locations continues. The list is growing into a respectable inventory.
  - d. Status of Big Blue Bus route changes in Venice

A Town Hall style meeting was held on March 9th with Big Blue Bus (BBB) See: <a href="http://argonautnews.com/bus-routes-cut-an-economic-divide/">http://argonautnews.com/bus-routes-cut-an-economic-divide/</a> for the Argnaut's story. Representatives (Mike Bonin moderated) - an estimated 250 residents attended. BBB explained new routes were required to bring passengers to new Expo Line (where there is limited parking). Alternative routes we proposed for BBB Route 1 (one route used ABK to get to MDR; another used Pacific - others presented) and BBB pledged to review the alternatives. Problems with Route 18 were also discussed.

Sarah reported an alternative for BBB Route 1 using ABK is receiving further review by BBB and ABK Merchants will be weighing in. The Canals and Ocean Ave, and Silver Triangle residents continue to be involved in asking for changes. No action has been taken to review Route 18.

e. Discussion of Homeless Town Hall held 3/29/16
CD11 Councilmember Mike Bonin held a Town Hall 3/29 to present his plan for implementing the City's new homeless strategy in Venice. The committee had time for only a few comments; opposition was heard to the idea of placing housing for homeless individuals on the city owned parking lot between North and South Venice (between Pacific and Dell). Taylor explained that this would be a long term process that is just at the beginning – the city will need to determine the number of homeless individuals to be housed. The committee observed that money – lots of it, will be required.
