School Highlight

Will Rogers Learning Community in Santa Monica - we brought together hundreds of volunteers including parents, students, school faculty and community members to transform nearly a half acre of underutilized land into one of the first working regenerative farms on a school campus in the Los Angeles area



Non-Profit Partnership Highlights

Boys Girls Club of Malibu (BGCM) - we set up gardens across the Malibu school district and provide weekly education on regenerative gardening and donut economic principles

Safe Place for Youth (SPY) - we set up edible/therapeutic gardens around the courtyard, and partnered to create community garden space at Beyond Baroque, to provide workshops to unhoused youth and provide employment opportunities

Neighborhood Youth Association (NYA) - we set up an edible landscape and work with low-income Latino families to provide access to healthy food through garden education programming

Community Healing Gardens - working in the Venice neighborhood to build gardens to increase publicly accessible food to unhoused and housed community members

Homeless Healthcare LA - setting up gardens around low-income housing and providing educational workshops for the community
