**Venice Dual Force Main Project**

Construction of a new 54-inch diameter force main sewer line to operate as a parallel system in conjunction with the existing sewer line. The project will increase capacity, create pipeline redundancy and allow for maintenance.

**Construction Activities scheduled for August 2017 through September 2017**  
**Overall Project Dates: Spring 2017 through Summer 2020**

<b>What work is planned for August 2017 through September 2017?</b>	Pre-Excavation of the shaft; equipment and material deliveries; Via Marina street trenching at Old Harbor Lane; telecommunication line installation.
<b>Where is the construction area?</b>	Activities will occur at the following location: County Beach Parking Lot # 13 at Via Marina
<b>What time are crews scheduled to work?</b>	Expected work hours are: County of Los Angeles: Mon – Fri, 8am – 5pm
<b>What can I expect?</b>	Noise associated with heavy equipment; delivery of construction materials; 80 feet tall crane; forklift; boom truck; concrete deliveries; excavation on Via Marina with reduction of lanes; minimal vibration due to pre-excavation of the shaft.
<b>Is local access impacted?</b>	No parking impacts. Via Marina local access maintained at all times.
<b>Safety Measures</b> (to protect the public and construction crew)	Appropriate traffic handling measures will be implemented to safely divert traffic through the construction zone. Safety barriers will be used in all construction areas.
