Pacific Project

- **Overview:**
- This project is the first of a long term commitment to bring the community and the police together in a combined effort to protect and preserve the communities within the Pacific Area. Community policing involves the community and without community cohesion the limited resources of LAPD are fragmented. Community Policing is NOT restricted to matters regarding of the LAW, rather all matters relating to quality of life, from disaster preparedness to whom do I contact if I need a cup of sugar or \$20. The Pacific Area, although diverse consists of neighborhoods that need to work together as neighbors until each block unites with the block next door and so on and so on.
- **Goal:**
- To show the officers and civilian personnel of the Pacific Area there is a community behind them. Improve communication, interaction – open the doors to interaction via: encouraging citizen volunteers, creating more active neighborhood watch programs, work with the DAPS to instill values and pride and the life tools to become successful citizens.
- **The Project:**
- Revitalize the Break and Cot Rooms at the Pacific Station to make them functional. Project to commence on “Big Sunday” with final dedication Protectors Week (5/14).

Fundraising:

Working through the Westchester Rotary Foundation funds are being raised to make this a reality. Through the vast network of community resources in Pacific Area both major and smaller home town business, individuals and groups are promoting this project.

- The Hotel Association is working to either donate or allow us to purchase at cost industrial quality appliances, mattresses etc.
 - An environmental company is arranging for plants and most importantly have begun a Garden Project with the DAPS* – the results of this effort will be unveiled at the “Dedication Ceremony” and throughout the year
- Neighborhood Watch Groups from Westchester to Venice to Palms are coming together with funds and donations from elbow grease to pots and tools
 - Westchester Neighbors Association Foundation has donated funds and supplies. We are optimistic other Neighborhood Associations will follow their example.
- Several cornerstone restaurants have committed to become involved in a long term relationship with Pacific LAPD.
 - There are 7 Neighborhood/Community Councils in the Pacific Area, each are either being approached or have been regarding funding for this project. We have requested both funding and elbow grease.

One Council has already approved the allocation of \$2000 for this project

An estimated \$20k in goods and services is needed to make this vision a reality.

The project encompasses long term community involvement from supporting National Night Out, the Station Open House, Special Olympic Torch Run, Holiday Dinners for Officers on Duty– Alternative Youth Programs, Citizen Volunteers at the station, active Neighborhood Watch Groups, CERT participation – (LAFD) community spirit.

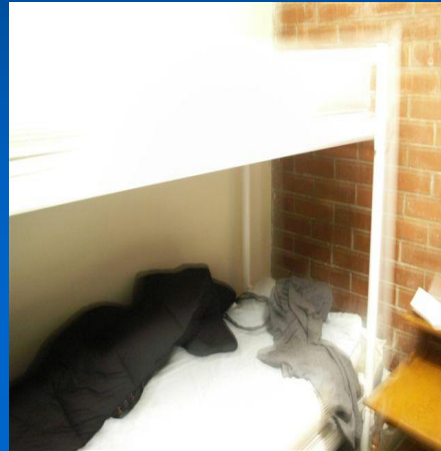
This revitalization project is the first step in bringing the communities of the Pacific Area together. We are building a chain one link at a time and dedicated to making each link strong and true.

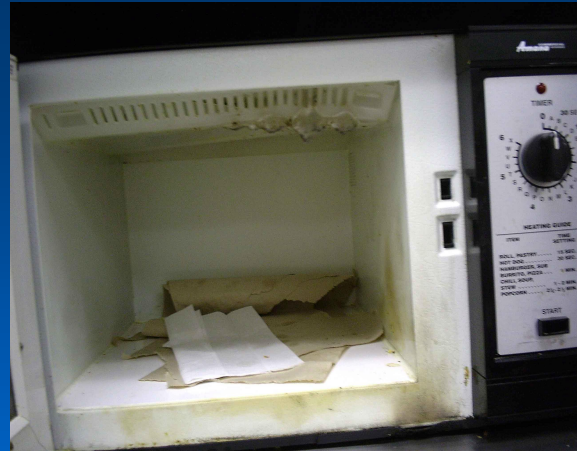
