PROJECT SUMMARY

This project is an application for legalization and continued use and maintenance of 7 residential dwelling units on one 3150 SF (35' wide x 90' deep) lot in the Marina Peninsula sub-area of the VCZSP. Original permits issued between 1971 and 1975 show 2 dwelling units, and 3 guest rooms. Owner purchased 4190 SF building in 1986, as it exists, with 2 permitted dwelling units and 5 illegal dwelling units. The project has a total of 7 parking spaces. No new construction is proposed.

MOTION: Whereas the original permit copies are confusing in terms of numbers of guest rooms and units (2, 3, 4 and 5 on different documents); and

Whereas the building has had seven units since the current owner purchased it in 1986; and

Whereas there are seven parking spaces for seven units in lieu of 16

LUPC recommends approving the project (legalization) with the following condition:

On two units, the rent will be rolled back to moderate affordable levels and, upon vacancy, new tenants will be required to qualify for moderate affordable under the Los Angeles Housing Department requirements.
